  - or ask your service provider to start using carrier ID
    - make it a contract requirement

  - Contribute to the CASBAA survey of C band receiver sites.
- Prepare for WRC 15 –
  - Brief your administration on the economic and social value of C band spectrum to the broadcasting industry
